Butterfly*, *The Front Page*, *Retreat from Moscow*, *All My Sons*, *The Columnist*, and the musicals *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels* and *Sweet Smell of Success* (his second Tony). In England, he has played Malvolio with the Royal Shakespeare Company and the title role in Arthur Wing Pinero's *The Magistrate* with the National Theatre. In 2014, he played the title role in The Public Theater's Shakespeare in the Park production of *King Lear*. In an illustrious film career, Lithgow has appeared in over fifty films, earning back-to-back Oscar nominations for *The World According to Garp* and *Terms of Endearment*. In 2018 Chicago Shakespeare was honored to present him with the Spirit of Shakespeare Award.

He is noted for collaborations with Coldplay, Mick Jagger, Dave Stewart, Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan, Sarni Yusuf, and U2 (his daughters,

Khatija and Raheema adding their vocals to the U2 track "Aahimsa" written to commemorate Mahatma Gandhi). Most recently, Rahman's time has been taken up with his new state of the art recording facility in Dubai, The Firdaus Studio, set up for producing orchestral sessions and recording high quality film soundtracks - and also establishing and mentoring the all-women orchestra comprising of musicians from over 23 nationalities called The Firdaus Orchestra.

A Conversation with the Director

Director Paul Hart discusses his vision for the musical US premiere of *The Lord of the Rings – A Musical Tale*.

What is it about the story of *The Lord of the Rings* that has captivated generations?

Paul Hart: J.R.R. Tolkien's *The Lord of the Rings* is one of the most beloved stories ever told, and the beautiful thing is that everyone has their own relationship with it. For me, what was so important is that we tell the story in a way that works for all audience members. So whether you're a huge fan of the piece and have seen every version of it, or whether you're coming to this completely fresh and it's a new story for you—I wanted to create a version that connected with everyone.

How does this story lend itself to being told with music live onstage?

Incorporating music is such a vital part of our storytelling in this adaptation. J.R.R. Tolkien uses songs all the way through the original stories, so the idea of using music to tell the story has always been a big part of it. I think it takes this adventure to another level because we're creating entirely different worlds through sounds and senses. We're creating this sense of huge scale and something that's really epic—and music plays a major role in how we're able to do that.





What is your entry point to this story?

I love that we meet the Hobbits right at the beginning of the show and that audiences become part of their world from the moment they arrive to the theater. As we're celebrating Bilbo Baggins' eleventy-first birthday in the Shire, the Hobbits introduce this story and we see this adventure through their perspective. We're interested in the idea of Hobbits being the ultimate storytellers. They love to create these tales, these narratives, and take the audience along with them on that journey.

Tell us more about the rehearsal process. What is it like collaborating with this ensemble of artists?

This process has been full of joy and full of energy. This company is such an amazing group of people, and they all bring their unique skills to the work. They're unbelievably talented actors, but many also play instruments, and dance, and do puppetry. Add on top of that the projections and other production elements, and suddenly we've crafted this truly unique experience. We start out at the beginning with this very simple way of telling a story, and it becomes more and more immersive and imaginative as we go through this tale.

What does it mean to you to launch this US premiere production in Chicago and at Chicago Shakespeare Theater?

It's a really big deal to be opening this show in America and to be staging the US premiere right here in Chicago for Chicago audiences. And for me, it's especially important that we're making it with Chicago Shakespeare Theater, which has that classical legacy of work. There are so many comparisons between Tolkien and Shakespeare and inspirations that Tolkien drew from Shakespeare in terms of creating the work initially. So, it always felt like the right place to do it. I'm excited to be creating this world for The Yard, which is such an amazing and epic space. We're really thrilled to be able to share this special experience with audiences. ■
